MICHAEL G. WOLFE

Michael G. Wolfe is the Deputy Director for the 366 Force Support Squadron, Mountain Home Air Force Base, Idaho. As the Deputy to the Commander, he leads a 350-member Force Support Squadron, providing manpower, personnel, morale, welfare, recreation and mortuary support to the Mountain Home, ID community, encompassing more than 4,300 military and civilian members. He is responsible for providing operational leadership oversight for 35 facilities with a combined \$2.2M annual non-appropriated fund (NAF) and appropriated fund (APF) operating budget and \$95M in equipment and facility assets.

Prior to his current position, Mr. Wolfe was a Community Services Analyst, Air Force Services Activity, Installation Support Branch, San Antonio, Texas.

Mr. Wolfe entered civil service in 1984 as a Seasonal Helitak Crew member at Ft. Washakie, WY and later transferred to the Grand Junction Helitak. After 5 summers in the civil service, Mr. Wolfe left to work in the private sector. In February 1992, Mr. Wolfe returned to civil service as an Outdoor Adventure Programmer at Malmstrom AFB, Mont. In 1996, Mr. Wolfe was selected by the Pentagon to participate in Operation Sea Signal, JTF 160, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, a program that implemented civilians into isolated remote areas. He later transferred to the Navy, and was selected by the Navy Personnel Center to represent Asia on the Navy Worldwide Outdoor Recreation Team. He then returned back to Malmstrom as the Youth Center Director later switching over to manage the Arts & Craft Center. In 2006, he transferred to Kunsan AB, Republic Of Korea to oversee the Recreation Complex until 2008 when he was promoted to Flight Chief at Osan AB, ROK. Mr. Wolfe attended the University of Montana, graduating with a Bachelor's Degree in Recreation Management.
